Councillors are the representative to ensure we are fulfilling the requirements of the local community. They will canvas to find out what improvement the people actually living in the area want from their council tax monies. Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has 19 elected representatives who serve as Parish Councillors; as democratically elected local representatives, they have a unique and privileged position and the potential to make a real difference to people's lives. They represent the interests of the whole community. Some represent a political party and others are independent of party affiliations

Electors can identify potential councilors and nominate candidates for election. Candidates must meet the required criteria to be councilors:

Lived in or within 3 miles of the parish boundary for the whole of the previous 12 months. Worked in the Parish as principle or only place of work during previous 12 months.





Green Road Chapel Restoration Project

After discussions to decide what work needs to be done the proposed works were taken to a Full Council meeting. It was resolved to replace the "thought to be original" wooden floor with a like for like replacement. The current floor is broken in a number of places, and needs replacing before the building can be used again.

The Governance Administrator is currently in talks with Steven Roe from the local Methodist Church about what events will be held once the chapel has been finished. It was mentioned to go into partnership with the Salvation Army to exhibit some art work that homeless individuals around the parish have made and possibly sell to raise money (all proceeds to go to The Salvation Army).

Our Governance Administrator has also been in touch with a local stained glass window company who are on board to install some temporary stained glass windows to the chapel once the renovations are complete.

NO INCREASE PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT IN 2023/2024

Date Issued: 13th January 2023

Stratton St Margaret Parish Councils Precept for 2023/24 was approved at the Full Council Meeting held on 11 January 2023. The Parish Council are pleased to announce that there was no requirement to request an increase in the precept that is funded by residents via their Council Tax.

Following a thorough and careful process which started in October 2022, the Council resolved to continue to fund services and projects through a precept of £187.10 per Band D property; a decrease of 75p per year per Band D property.

The Band D average figure is used to work out the cost of the precept per household, which reflects the impact of changes in growth assumptions, the number of households receiving single persons discount and/or other discounts and exemptions.

The funding puts in place provision to ensure the effective delivery of all the Councils existing activities and services thereby ensuring that protection of these activities and services are achieved.

The Chairman of the Finance & General Purposes Committee, Barrie Jennings extended his gratitude within the Full Council Meeting to the Finance Team for putting together this budget.

The Chairman to the Council, Rob Jandy has the following quote:

"A big thank you and congratulations to the Councils budgeting Officers, Finance Team and Finance and General Purposes Committee for achieving 0% precept increase for the 4th consecutive year, especially during the cost of living crisis."

OPEN SPACES

An Introduction to our Open Spaces Management

Our Open Spaces Management team have been doing what they do for decades and we think their experience shows. It might surprise you how busy and complicated public land management can be, so please read on to get a taste of it...



- Our 4 largest land areas are; Merton Fields 17.5 acres, Meadowcroft Park 14 acres, Greenbridge Recreation Ground 7 acres, Grange Park 5.2 acres and St Margaret's Cemetery 3.8 acres.
- We have machinery to aid us in our work including; 1 tractor with a variety of implements to attach, 1 smaller tractor with loader, 4 large ride on mowers and 1 mini digger.
- We mow our grass every 3 weeks starting end of March until end of October. Some priority areas such as children's play areas and sheltered accommodation bungalows are done fortnightly.
- We have around 2 miles of hedges that are trimmed 1-3 times a year.
- We spend around £75,000 a year clearing rubbish and emptying our 137 bins. 2 men do this full time working very efficiently.
- We have 2 active and beautifully maintained cemeteries and we provide full burial services. In 2022 we carried out 24 full burials and 45 ashes interments in total.
- We spend around £15,000 annually hiring independent surveyors and tree surgeons to aid the maintain our trees.
- We have 2 allotment sites and 151 registered tenants.
- We have 10 children's play areas and 4 basketball/mini soccer courts. We spend around 1,100 hours each year managing and maintaining them at an annual cost of around £17,000. This excludes large improvement projects.
- We have already created and actively manage 5 acres of wild flower meadow. Species diversity is improving annually.
- We usually plant at least 700 trees every year. Some large and many small.
- We provide flower displays in many flower beds and planters around the parish.
- We investigate every single land based enquiry we receive and respond to every resident.

Oliver says; "At the time of writing, we are about to commence our very first apprenticeship scheme. A young man from Swindon has successfully gained an apprenticeship with us for the next 18 months and will work within our team daily, whilst also undertaking a part time training course in Horticulture, at Lackham College. This will bring our team up to 10 full time people in total, including myself. We also have a specialist gardener that helps us with our flower beds for just 6 months of the year, 10 hours a week.

It requires a large, well organised and very determined effort to keep all of our land clean and tidy and our assets up to date. This is the level of staffing that i believe is necessary in order to provide the services to our land that local people expect and deserve. I have worked hard to justify building resources to this level. I'm really proud of my team, they all work hard and bring different skills to the table"


Foxes!

We wish to reiterate our opinion we have on Foxes. These animals are highly intelligent and adaptable and do not need our assistance to exist.

Fox populations have grown rapidly in the last 25 years due to excessive amounts of food being made available to them by humans. In 1995, their population numbered around 240,000 in the UK. By 2018, this number reached 357,000 (Natural England, Mathews et al 2018). Latest numbers are unknown.

They can be very disruptive to gardens, smallholdings and to farming.

Please do not feed them. Allow their wild population to live in
balance with us instead.

OPEN SPACES cont.

The Parish Council is passionate about the environment and with the Senior Open Spaces Officer we are always looking for ways to make our services more sustainable and environmentally beneficial, without this affecting the core services that people really want. The Council now has a Biodiversity Action Plan to promote this balance. You can find this plan on our website.









Here are some of the positive changes that have been introduced to our services in recent years:

- 5 acres of wild flower meadow already created and another 2 are being added in 2023, most notably at Covingham Drive and Merlin Way road verges. Native wild flower seed has been sown into the existing grass using a chain harrow and hand sowing.
- Around 10,000 trees planted in the last 6 years, many of them into new hedges. This has included several community orchards where fruit trees are now available to the public.
- Various specific habitat improvement projects undertaken, including the dredging of ponds at Church Park (nxt to St Margaret's Church) and Claridges (Marshfield Way) and the installation of hibernacula's for amphibians to hibernate within.
- At our workshop we have just increased our rainwater collection capacity, taking it up to 8,000 litres total. Using our trailer mounted water bowser, with pump, we use rainwater (which is more beneficial to plants than tap water) to water our flowers and new trees especially during the summer, when droughts are becoming more common.
- In 2020 we changed our rubbish collection services so that a large proportion of the waste we collect is taken away and burned in an incinerator to produce electricity.
- We recycle as much of the waste as we can, especially metal and timber. Plastic is difficult logistically for us to recycle, for further information on our waste services contact our office.
- We have changed 2 of our vans over to fully electric models in the last 2 years. They produce zero emissions within our parish and are invaluable to our services.
- · We have converted most of our handheld groundscare machinery, such as strimmers and chainsaws over to electric, so that they are not producing harmful emissions. These machines are also guieter and more comfortable to use.
- We have closely examined our travelling and we ensure our vehicle usage is reduced as much as we can. This includes ensuring we empty our 137 bins efficiently.





We also have 4 public computers available for use, no need to book these, just come along!


Did you know?

We are also in the process of making some changes to our website so it's more user friendly by both our website and mobile phone viewing. We want to make sure that when you go to view our website all pages clicked onto, you're able to scroll through smoothly.

Named for an Old Testament pathway to Heaven seen in a dream, the pub in Ermin Street, Stratton St Margaret, may have been the area's earliest. The building, or parts of it, date back to the 18th century. Closed and boarded up by 1999, it was later converted to homes.

Originally called 'Three Cups' mentioned in a 1650's deed, and a marriage settlement in 1670's, later owned by R Reed when transferred to T & E Gilbert in 1702, and then to P. Goddard in 1738. It is believed that the name changed when owned by a William Jacob. The pub was one of only two pubs of this name in the whole of England (the other is in Cornwall).

Parish Developments







Our new public bicycle repair and maintenance stand provides a workstation for cyclists to make self-service repairs when they're out and about. The station can also be used to repair pushchairs & wheelchairs! All the necessary repair tools are enclosed within the unit including; Hex key set, phillips screwdriver, flat screwdriver, adjustable spanner, flat wrench 8×10 mm, flat wrench13×15 mm, tyre levers and an integrated pump. This will be installed at Meadowcroft Recreational Ground soon. We hope this will be used and loved by many in the local area!

At the end of November our Stratton St Margaret Parish Council office & grounds team planted some beautiful plants around Meadowcroft & filled the new flowerbeds.

We planted early flowering Crocuses around the office and native bluebells into the wild flower areas on the park. Crocus flowers lead the way for other spring bloomers to follow. They bloom bright and early, bringing much needed color after a long winter.

We can't wait to see them bloom throughout spring!







Meadowcroft Park Investment 2023

A new road sign has been fitted directing you from Meadowcroft Road into Addison Crescent. If you turn down this road you'll find Stratton st Margaret's parish council offices. Also located here is Meadowcroft Community hall, many free public parking spaces, Meadowcroft field, park and soon the skatepark; planned to be completed by spring 2023!

Our newly resurfaced and widened pathway at Meadowcroft Park is now complete. In total it is 340 meters long. We plan to install a bench along the path overlooking the beautiful Meadowcroft green. This busy route is now safe and sound for many years to come!









Meadowcroft path markings

We have just installed playground markings onto our newly resurfaced 340 meter tarmac path at Meadowcroft Park. Huge play and learning benefits for a relatively small investment. We will be adding these into other areas across Stratton over time!

- Complete pond at White Hart Allotments and improve the access ramp to the site. Replace water taps with water troughs.
- Carry out coppicing and other habitat management work at Merton Fields Park.
- Complete winter safety work to trees. 11 small contracts have been agreed with local contractors and are being delivered.


